## TIPS:

- Suitcase weight (usually maximum 20 kg p.p.) and check the dimensions of your airline's hand luggage.
- Liquids in hand luggage usually in 100 ml containers, maximum 1 l in total.
- Take chewing gum in your hand luggage (chewing during the flight helps against earache)
- Take headphones for TV on the plane (alternatively, they can be purchased on board for a fee).
- mark your belongings such as water bottles by name so that there is no confusion.
- In France, long or loose swimming trunks are often forbidden.
- Italian campsites often require bathing caps to ensure the cleanliness of the pool.
